### **Reading with your Child**

Reading with your child can mean sharing books, stories, rhymes, or any other writing. In school, we encourage our children to do lots of talking about the books they have read. Share stories whenever you can, we ask for just ten minutes a day-it can make a huge difference. You can:

- Read books, magazines, newspapers-anything together and talk about the stories.
- Chat about the things that you have read.
- Talk about pictures in books.
- Share stories even when you don't have a book in front of you. Why not re-tell your favourite stories?



# Ask questions when you are reading together. For example:

- What do you see on this page?
- How do you think the characters feel?
- What do you think is going to happen next?
- What did you like about the story?
- What didn't you like?
- What can they remember about what happened?
- Who was their favourite character?
- Link the story to their own
- experiences. Can they remember

#### when they did something similar?





#### What if English isn't my first language?

You don't have to only read books in English.

Carry on sharing books, stories and rhymes in your first language!

- Your child may use English words
- you can still reply or repeat what

they have said in your own language.

Children love the sound of your voice and can cope with two languages.

• Sharing stories is about more than just learning to read – it's about snuggling up and spending time together.




## Littlemoor Reading Royalty

We teach reading skills weekly and then throughout the week we apply, practise and embed the skills: define, retrieve, sequence, predict, infer, relate, explore, compare and summarise. Children who impress their teacher with their reading have the chance to be crowned Reading King or Queen.



## The teaching of early reading at Littlemoor

We teach phonics using Read, Write Inc from Reception to Year 2 to teach early reading skills. What Read Write Inc. does is simple - we teach sounds (starting with the set 1 sounds below in grey) children practise reading and spelling words containing these sounds , then we give children decodable book bag books to take home containing sounds and words they can read. They read each Storybook three times at school. On each reading, children's fluency increases and the more they can focus on what the story is about. Children also learn to spell the words they have been reading and develop their ideas into sentences so that they can write about the Storybooks they read. More information regarding the teaching of phonics will follow in upcoming newsletters.
